- ALEV High School is known for outstanding student achievement, a broad program of extra-curricular activities, and a blend of Turkish and Austrian cultural values.
- ALEV High School consists of 23 full time staff and 101 students.

# CURRICULUM

- The education is consistent with the Ministry of Education principles and basic curriculum.
- The diploma areas available are Science, Turkish-Mathematics and Social Sciences and involve more courses in those areas in addition to common courses at each grade level.



- The 36 hour academic week, depending on the diploma area, includes 4-6 hours of Turkish, 5 hours of German in grade 9 and 6 hours in grades 10-12 and 5-6 hours of a second foreign language of English. Aside from these language courses, students also have history, geography, religion and ethics, military science, philosophy, biology, chemistry, physics, mathematics, and physical Education as core requirements that are spread throughout the high school years. German, mathematics and science are all taught in German while Turkish is required language of instruction in Turkish, social science, art and music. To supplement the core, a variety of electives are available in English and literature.
